As borders closed and airports shut down due to COVID-19, I found myself stuck and was unable to leave the country until September, almost six months later. It was an eye-opening experience.

Lockdowns hit the area hard. Many people lost their jobs and income for months. Thanks to your generosity, we were able to distribute food and other basic needs to those who needed it most.

Having a little more freedom than most, I had access to a vehicle. Several times I was able to drive some guys to the hospital, either for virus testing, or a scorpion bite, or a sick child. I heard some of the guys ask, behind my back, if all Americans were like this. I would have liked to have had the chance to reply that it was my Christian faith that gave me the desire to serve them. But I believe they see that.

Despite being in a place many see as hostile toward westerners and Christianity, I was able to build some meaningful relationships and even have encouraging conversations about my faith.

As I witnessed the physical needs of the community and saw potential for spiritual fruit, we began praying about how One Vision can help provide for needs in this community long-term. God has blessed us with the friendship and favor of decision makers in the region who make our service there possible. We consulted them about how to best meet needs in the community. The answer was clear: education.
